## Description

---

The Prize was established in 2019 and is funded by Stantec New Zealand.

The main purpose of the Prize is to recognise and reward the student who has demonstrated an excellent understanding of the principles of sustainability in a planning context. The Prize has been awarded previously by the School of Architecture and Planning as the MWH Planning and Sustainability Award.

## Selection process

---

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize is awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of the School of Architecture and Planning

## Regulations

---

1. The Prize will be known as the Stantec New Zealand Planning and Sustainability Prize.
2. One Prize will be awarded annually, and will be of the value of \$500.
3. The Prize will be awarded to the student who produces work in the Bachelor of Urban Planning (Honours) degree that demonstrates an excellent understanding of the principles of sustainability in a planning context, including the four well-beings, holistic approaches and integrated management (see Note I).
4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council upon the recommendation of the Head of Department of School of Architecture and Planning.
5. The Prize may not be shared.
6. The University of Auckland Council has the power to amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
7. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if in any year there are no candidates of sufficient merit.
8. Note [I] below is deemed to be a Regulation.
