

# T W J Johnson Scholarship in Clinical Medicine

## Description

The funds for this Scholarship are provided from a bequest made by Mrs Mary Lillian Johnson for the promotion and encouragement of and research into clinical medicine.

## Selection process

- Application is made to the Scholarships Office
- A Selection Committee assesses the applications
- The Award is made by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Selection Committee

## Regulations

1. The Scholarship will be known as the T W J Johnson Scholarship in Clinical Medicine.
2. The Scholarship shall be awarded annually and will be of the value of up to \$6,000.
3. The Scholarship may be awarded to a student who has successfully completed Part III of the Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (MBChB) degree at the University of Auckland and is undertaking the Bachelor of Medical Sciences (Honours) research year in clinical medicine.
4. The basis of selection will be academic merit and the quality and nature of the applicant's research proposal. Successful candidates will have a grade point average (GPA) of at least 7.00.
5. The Scholarship will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council upon the recommendation of a Selection Committee comprising the Dean of the Faculty of Medical and Health Sciences (or nominee), the Associate Dean (Postgraduate) of the Faculty of Medical and Health Sciences (or nominee) and one other academic staff member of the Faculty of Medical and Health Sciences nominated by the Dean of the Faculty of Medical and Health Sciences.
6. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to award the Scholarship in any year if there are no candidates of sufficient merit.
7. The Scholarship will be paid in two instalments, in the third week of Semester One and Semester Two.
8. The University of Auckland Council has the power to terminate or suspend a Scholarship if it receives a report of unsatisfactory progress of a Scholar from the Associate Dean (Postgraduate) of the Faculty of Medical and Health Sciences.

9. The University of Auckland Council has the power to amend or vary these Regulations, provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Scholarship.
10. Applications close with the Scholarships Office on 1 November in the year preceding the award.
11. Note [I] below is deemed to be a regulation.

## Notes

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- I. For the purpose of this Scholarship, academic merit is assessed as a Scholarships GPA obtained over the candidate's most recent two years of full-time graded study.*
