

# Te Toka Tumai/Auckland Hospital Chief Nursing Officer Prize

## Description

The Prize was established in 2009 by the Faculty of Medical and Health Sciences, with amendments made in 2022 to reflect contemporary Nursing Practice.

The main purpose of the Prize is to recognise the student from the Bachelor of Nursing or Master of Nursing Science programmes, who has demonstrated the highest level of excellence in holistic nursing care and teamwork, including demonstration of Te Toka Tumai values, culminating in an excellent performance during the final clinical placement at Te Toka Tumai.

## Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council upon the recommendation of the Head of School of Nursing

## Regulations

1. The Prize will be known as the Te Toka Tumai/Auckland Hospital Chief Nursing Officer Prize.
2. The Prize will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$1,000.
3. Students who are completing their final clinical placement for the Bachelor of Nursing or Master of Nursing Science programmes at Te Toka Tumai are eligible to be nominated for this Prize.
4. The Prize will be awarded annually to the Bachelor of Nursing or Master of Nursing Science student who has completed their final transition to practice placement at Te Toka Tumai and who has demonstrated the highest level of excellence in holistic nursing care and teamwork, including demonstration of Te Toka Tumia values (see Note I), culminating in an excellent performance during the final clinical placement.
5. Nominations will initially be made by clinical lecturers and reviewed by the Associate Head (Pre-Registration Programmes) of the School of Nursing, who will seek clinical feedback of each nominee in their Nursing programme.

6. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of School of Nursing (or nominee) and the Chief Nursing Officer (Te Toka Tumai) (or nominee), in consultation with the clinical areas where the nominee completed their official placement.
7. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
8. In the event of a tie, the Head of the School of Nursing (or nominee) shall determine if the prize may be shared.
9. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
10. Notes [I]-[II] below are deemed to be regulations.
