Horizons of History: Space, Time and the Future of the Past

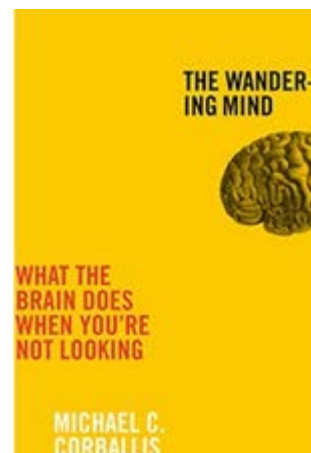
