## Sample timetable

Each course involves about ten hours of work each week. This includes attending classes (three to four hours per course) and working independently, either at home or at University (six to seven hours per course).

The diagram below is an example of what a weekly timetable might look like. It's up to you how you manage your work and where you study – but it is very important to make good use of your time outside classes and to plan ahead so you can complete coursework on time.
