Statistics NZ Ethnicity definition

An ethnic group is made up of people who have some or all of the following characteristics:

- a common proper name
- one or more elements of common culture which need not be specified, but may include religion, customs, or language
- unique community of interests, feelings and actions
- a shared sense of common origins or ancestry, and
- a common geographic origin.

This definition is based on the work of Smith (1986).

- -Grounded in reality?




Possible Alternatives
