Language Requirement	<p>Valid Proof of English Language Proficiency (Official TOEFL or IELTS results). Minimum 80 IBT and at least 18 on each subsection; or Minimum 6.5 IELTS with at least 6.5 on each subsection.</p> <p>Students who attend the American University in Cairo, American University of Sharjah, American University of Beirut, American University of Nigeria, or American College of Thessaloniki may use two approved academic English writing courses to fulfill this requirement.</p>
GPA Requirement	3.0 on a 4.0 scale
Required fees paid by exchange students	<p>\$321 per semester or \$642 per year - Sports Center fee, Technology Fee, Metro's University Pass</p> <p>Any housing or meal plan provided through the University</p> <p>Student Health Insurance</p>
Insurance Information	<p>Students are automatically covered by the American University student insurance. The possibility to waive the AU health insurance will require proof of insurance that meets a number of requirements, including the insurance plan must be provided by a company licensed to do business in the United States, with a claims payment office and a US Phone number. Students should be prepared to pay for the AU student health insurance.</p>
Housing	<p>Housing is available on-campus. Students must apply by the May 1 deadline. Abroad at AU students are most commonly housed in double rooms in Traditional Style Halls (Hughes, Leonard, McDowell) or Suite Style Halls (East Campus, Cassell, Centennial). FINANCIAL DOCUMENTS FOR J-1 (STUDENT) VISA: If you intend to apply for an J-1 (student) visa, you will be required by a U.S. consular officer to present a Form DS2019 and supporting financial documents to **demonstrate your ability to meet financial obligations for your academic program** (costs are outlined above). In order to obtain a Form DS2019 from American University, the student must first be admitted into the university. IMPORTANT ADDITIONAL COSTS: Students should be able to meet the following costs as they apply to their particular situation (*an increase of approximately 5-7% for each succeeding academic year should be anticipated*):

1. Travel expenses between home country and U.S. during vacation periods
2. Large purchases (such as computers, furniture, etc.)
3. Medical expenses not covered by health insurance (eye care, dental care, medical problems developed before arriving at the university)
4. Additional summer expenses (if any) including tuition and fees, room and board, and books
5. Additional expenses such as travel during vacation periods and off-campus transportation
6. Other personal expenses (such as entertainment, social outings, etc.)
7. Additional family members (if any)

FAMILY EXPENSES: Married students who plan to bring their families should add at least \$5,500 for their spouse and \$4,000 for each child per year to their annual living expenses.

ON-CAMPUS HOUSING: Rent estimates are based on on-campus shared rooms (double occupancy) in most of the residence halls for undergraduate students. Residence Halls are closed during the inter-session/summer break (between Fall and Spring semesters) and students are responsible for finding alternative housing during this time. OFF-CAMPUS HOUSING: Rent estimates are based on the average cost for a shared one-bedroom apartment. Rent may include all utilities except telephone service. If utilities are not included, additional costs each month should be anticipated. Normally, students must also purchase or rent furnishings, such as a television, furniture, and cooking utensils. In general, it is not possible to locate off-campus housing by mail or phone. Students should also budget for transportation costs, which vary greatly depending on distance from the university and on preferred type of public or private transportation. ON-CAMPUS DINING: Estimated meal expenses are based on a variety of on-campus "meal plan" options, which range in costs per semester. The University Dining Services will be closed during the Thanksgiving break, summer break, and spring break. Students should plan to make other dining arrangements during these times. Therefore, students should plan to budget additional costs during these periods for meal expenses. Residence Halls are also closed from during the inter-session break (between Fall and Spring semesters) and students are responsible for finding alternative housing during this time.

HEALTH INSURANCE: All full-time international students (except those holding an A, G, or H visa) are required to purchase health insurance. International students are automatically enrolled and billed for the university-sponsored insurance plan. Students may waive this fee if proof of a comparable plan is provided to the Health Center. Students on an F-1 or J-1 visa must provide health insurance for their dependents as well. Students who begin their studies in the summer semester must purchase separate insurance for the summer term.
