## **General comments:**

i) While there is great potential for benefit from digital innovations, some population groups lack access to technology and would be further disadvantaged by reliance on digital delivery of health services.

- ii) The care workforce is ageing. There is a need for the health sector to actively promote itself as a career choice. Ensuring fair employment conditions for this workforce is a necessary first step to solving the problem.
- iii) Increased income support to low income households would greatly improve the effectiveness of the health strategy to reduce inequities. Evidence supporting the relationship between low income and poor health outcomes is abundant.
- iv) In addition to the requirement for a larger 'care' workforce, the ageing of the population requires increased funding to health and hospital services. Research by the Ministry of Health has found that increased longevity means increased years of ill-health and/or frailty.
