

## **Council resolutions**

*The recommendations below were adopted by the University Council at its meeting on 20 October 2008.*

It is recommended that Council adopt the following principles as the basis for campus development:

1. As far as possible, teaching and research activities should be concentrated on the City/Grafton campus.
2. University strategy should drive faculty and campus plans.
3. It is desirable to co-locate units according to today's faculty boundaries and to locate a department's undergraduate and postgraduate teaching, and its research, together.
4. Each campus should have: a stable and sustainable level of academic activity; facilities and an environment that support quality teaching, learning and research; and an appropriate level and mix of support services.
5. Highest priorities for centrally located campus space should be teaching and learning, and support functions for students.

It is further recommended that Council approve the following intentions for campus development, noting that in some cases considerable further work will be required before firm recommendations can be presented to Council, and in all cases Council or its Capital Expenditure Committee will retain the authority to approve significant capital expenditure that may arise from these proposals:

1. Law: to be developed on the present Waterloo Quadrant/Eden Crescent site
2. Arts: to be consolidated in the 200 sector
3. Engineering: to be consolidated on the present site, with some research and postgraduate activities to be further developed at Tamaki
4. NICAI: Elam to relocate to new premises to be constructed adjacent to Architecture and Planning; the future location and extent of Music to be considered further as part of the Faculty's accommodation planning process
5. Science: SGGES and Psychology to relocate from HSB and Tamaki to 300 sector (subject to proposal 9); other components of the Faculty to remain in their present locations
6. Medical and Health Sciences and Liggins to be consolidated on the Grafton Campus, except for the School of Population Health (Tamaki) and clinical facilities at Auckland, Mercy, Middlemore & Waikato hospitals
7. Education: to be relocated in whole or part to the City Campus. We recommend further work to address the nature of facilities that would be required on the City Campus by a research-intensive Faculty of Education and consultation to address such issues as the location of Physical Education and Team Solutions.
8. Student accommodation: to be developed on the 400S sector

9. Tamaki: to be developed primarily as a campus specializing in postgraduate and research activity, where for a particular reason that activity's academic objectives will be better served by location at Tamaki than at the City/Grafton campus.
