

Appendix 1 – Evidence of Scholarly Eminence

Evidence of scholarly eminence in a discipline will include an appropriate range of the following:

- <u>Publication</u> of the results of original research and other scholarly endeavour in <u>refereed</u> journals of high international standing;
- Publication of <u>books and monographs</u> through publishing houses of high national/international reputation;
- Publication of the results of original research and other scholarly endeavour in conference proceedings that are subject to peer review;
- Awards of nationally and internationally esteemed <u>prizes and honours;</u>
- Publication of advanced <u>multi-media materials</u> and/or <u>textbooks</u> in the candidate's field of expertise through publishing houses of high national/international repute and which are <u>prescribed for use in other</u> institutions of high standing;
- Publication through <u>exhibition and performance</u> of creative work in venues of high national and international repute;
- Publication of <u>peer reviews and critiques</u> in nationally and internationally recognised forums, of the outcomes of original excellent art or design activity;
- Demonstrated record of <u>editorial leadership</u> in the dissemination of knowledge;
- Publication of <u>reports commissioned</u> by government agencies and international organisations;
- Record of achievement in the <u>transfer and application</u> of the results of research and development <u>to industry and commerce</u>, the professions and wider community;
- Reports on <u>consultancies</u> carried out for industrial and commercial firms involving work of <u>demonstrable academic significance</u>;
- Successful applications for <u>patents and licences</u> based on original research and development;
- Experience and demonstrable success in leading research teams;
- Ability to attract funds from external peer adjudicated granting agencies;
- Ability to attract funds for <u>contract research</u> from government agencies, industry and commerce and the academic significance of the work carried out;
- Contributions to <u>clinical practice</u> of <u>demonstrable academic significance</u>;
- Leadership in the generation of <u>collaborative research and development</u> programmes with other institutions including universities, government agencies, industry and commerce;
- Record of effective contribution to the <u>development of a discipline</u> in the wider community;
- Representation of <u>original works of art</u> in major national and <u>international publications</u>;
- Representation of <u>original works of art</u> in public and private collections of <u>national and international significance;</u>
- Original designs and executed structures or instruments which result in distinguished professional standing;
- Record of willing and effective provision of academic guidance to junior colleagues;



Other evidence which may be presented might include:

- High category of membership of professional societies and associations;
- <u>Leadership in professional societies</u> and associations as demonstrated by the holding of executive office;
- Membership of nationally and internationally recognised honorific societies;
- Membership of government advisory bodies, committees of inquiry and boards of management;
- Invitations to serve as a <u>referee or adjudicator</u> by major national and competitive award-granting schemes or organisations;
- Invitations to serve as external examiner in other higher educational institutions;
- Invitations to speak at major international conferences;
- Invitations to serve as <u>visiting Professor in other higher educational institutions</u> or as a visiting academic in government departments and agencies;
- Invitations to edit special issues of prestigious journals or books;
- Invitations to serve as <u>external member</u> on high level selection committees;
- Appointment to international journal Editorial Boards;
