#### New students - can you enrol yet?

If you have applied for admission to this programme, have been offered and accepted a place in the programme, and have met all the conditions of the offer including admission to the university, you will then be made an active student in the programme and will be able to enrol into your courses for semesters 1 and 2.

**Full -time students:** You have 8 15 point courses that you must undertake this year, plus EDUCSW199A & B which is 0 point.

**Part-time Students:** Please choose two courses to do in each semester. Please note that you can't enrol into EDPROFST 102 and EDPRAC 100 until your second year of study.

Please enrol by selecting your courses using **Search by Class Number** as indicated below.

**\*EDPROFM 100 and EDCURRIC 117** are taught in both semesters one and two. You cannot enrol into both in the same semester. Instead, you should enrol in the alternate course the following semester.

<b>GENERAL EDUCATION</b>	<p><b>For those not required to complete AELR You may take ENGLISH 121G or any other General Education course</b> available from <u>either</u> the <b>Open schedule</b> or the <b>Education and Social Work</b> schedule - see details following. Only courses with the <b>G suffix</b> from those schedules will satisfy the General Education requirement. Also note that you must select courses from outside of your degree area (i.e., no identical course codes e.g., EDUC 100G and EDUC 114)</p> <p><b>Choose a course that does <u>not</u> clash with your BED (Teaching) Primary timetable. Please allow for travelling time if the course you select is taught at the City campus.</b></p> <p><b>Please note that during your first semester of study, you will complete a two-week in-school fulltime placement. You will be granted leave to attend your General Education course only <u>once</u> per week. You should ensure that the weekly lectures in the course you choose are recorded – you would then use your leave from your school placement to attend your weekly tutorial.
