General Education

You need to enrol in a General Education course from either the [Open schedule](#) or the [Education and Social Work Schedule](#). Only courses with the **G suffix** from those schedules will satisfy the General Education requirement. If you choose a course from the Open Schedule, you mustn't choose a course with a subject area of Education. Choose a course that does not clash with your timetable and allow for travel time if the course you select is taught at the City Campus. **Note:** During Semester One, you will complete a fulltime two-week in-school introduction placement (4-14 April 2022). You will be granted leave to attend your General Education course once per week. We recommend that you check with the course that the lectures are recorded for you to access and use your leave to attend the tutorial. Some courses have been granted exemption from lecture recording - check carefully.

What is an enrolment concession?

While enrolling, you may receive a message about enrolment concessions. There are different reasons you may need a concession such as not meeting the prerequisites, a timetable clash, repeating the course or the class is full, and it is required for your degree. You may be able to [apply for a concession](#) follow the instructions given to submit a concession. **Note:** Concessions take time to process, submit this as early as you can or speak to an Advisor in the faculty for assistance.

Practicum Placement

You will receive an email about how and when to complete the online practicum placement request form once you are enrolled in your practicum course. You will not be able to access the online site until 24 hours after your enrolment. Students will also have a two-week introduction placement in April. Students will then return to the same school to complete their five-week placement in August.

DELNA

DELNA is an assessment of your academic language skills. All first-year students must complete the 30-minute DELNA screening to establish your current skillset. Some students will go on to complete a DELNA diagnosis, this will identify areas in your skillset that we can provide ongoing support for you. The tasks assigned from the diagnosis are a requirement of the faculty and finishing these will credit the completion of the compulsory course EDUCSW 199 (A/B). Academic Integrity
