ABOUT THE SCHOLARSHIP

- Scholarship valued at \$33,000 p.a. plus compulsory fees for up to 36 months full-time study
- Available to full-time domestic students and domestic fee-paying international students
- Paid work may not exceed 750 hours per 12-month period of scholarship tenure
- Applicants who already have a doctorate are not eligible for consideration

Expressions of interest due 1 October 2023; Application for doctoral programme due 1 November 2023; Enrolment in doctoral programme required by 1 March or 1 June 2024 (or 1 September for international candidates).
