

"The Bachelor of Education (Teaching) courses are really interesting. There is a lot of pedagogical content learning about the child's thinking and how we can best respond to them.

"We do a lot of reflection, which I think is good in helping you find yourself as a person, the kind of teacher I want to be and the kind of people I want to help my students become as well. "We learn a lot of te reo Māori and why that is important and quite a lot of Pasifika as well, with the new Tapasā Pasifika learning introduced for teachers.

"I love that we go on practicum placements at different stages of the year because we get to see how they are at the beginning and how they change. There is a moment when you see that they get it, they get the answer and it is just so exciting.

"My experience with one of my teachers in intermediate school made me want to become a teacher. It changed my mindset and made me realise the impact one person can have on someone's life. Teaching is a very important job."

- Gain an approved qualification for professional certification and registration in New Zealand primary and intermediate schools (typically children aged 5–13).
- Enter a profession that is high in demand in New Zealand and overseas.
- Gain the tools you need to prepare for the 21st century classroom, and achieve equitable outcomes for all learners.

- Spend 24 weeks on practicum in a range of schools, observing teaching approaches, developing your skills and building important relationships with prospective employers.
- Develop your knowledge of *The New Zealand Curriculum* and the eight essential learning areas: English, Science, Mathematics and Statastics, Technology, Social Sciences, Arts, Learning Languages, and Health and Physical Education.
- Learn from academics who are experts in the field of education and passionate about training the next generation of teachers.
- Explore a range of scholarships to support you, including TeachNZ Scholarships, worth up to \$30,000.
- Access a range of mentoring programmes, support groups and counselling services for students.
- Develop transferable skills that can be applied in many roles, such as curriculum leader, school leader, education consultant, researcher, policy adviser and special needs education specialist.

"Having a child of my own pushed me to come back to university. I wanted to have a meaningful and purposeful job, so I picked the Bachelor of Education.

It's definitely a family feel here. The lecturers are handson and make time for you if you don't understand any content. They have really assisted in building my knowledge, and then preparing me for the hands-on experience of the practicum. A lot of feedback I've received is that University of Auckland students are very well prepared for the practicum.

One reason why I wanted to become a teacher, was that I didn't feel like my cultural views were seen as successful when I was in school. With me, Pasifika kids will see a Pasifika teacher. Our knowledge may be similar, and I can grasp ways where I can teach them to learn in what is their everyday environment. I'd love to be here and build up the next generation to come through in South Auckland."

"In 2018, I started working as a learning support in a social service which helps kids to deal with the adverse effects of trauma. I quickly discovered that I have a passion for working with children, and especially enjoyed being in a classroom setting. The teachers there were amazing, and they pushed me to enrol in the Bachelor of Education (Teaching) programme at the University of Auckland.

"The whole team at Tai Tonga put in so much work to create a feeling of community, and it really shows. I've seen my cohort specifically grow as a group, maturing and learning together, and we've come to really feel like a whānau in this unique space that has been provided for us. One of the things I've learned from being in my cohort is that anyone can come and excel as long as you're willing and able to commit to the work. I feel very grateful to have this place and these people. Speaking for myself, I wouldn't be doing half as well as I am if I were anywhere else.

"The students are the best thing about working in school environments. After graduation I am really looking forward to having my own classroom. I'm leaning towards teaching older primary or intermediate aged kids as I've had such great experiences with years 5-8 across my placements so far. I have found relationships are foundational to any meaningful learning and being invested in the students as people makes teaching feel very rewarding. For anyone who cares about kids getting a good education, Te Papa Ako o Tai Tonga is an excellent place to learn to teach."
