Educational issues are pressing concerns in our society. The course will help develop understanding of the background of today's public debates around schooling and will introduce ways in which educational thought and research addresses big topics.

By the end of this course it is expected that the student will be able to:

- 1 Society's competing expectations from schools, and the ways in which schooling is organised to achieve these aims.
- 2 The broad demands that these debates and issues place upon educators.
- 3 The implications of the changing demographic and cultural mix of Aotearoa New Zealand, and more particularly Auckland demand of education.
