### **EDUC 119: DEVELOPMENT, LEARNING AND TEACHING(15 POINTS)**

#### **Semester One**

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#### **Course Prescription**

Presents an introduction to developmental and psychological theory and research and its application to teaching and learning within a variety of educational settings. Understandings for creating effective learning environments which foster high levels of motivation for all learners will be identified through an exploration of typical and atypical development, and behavioural, cognitive, constructivist and social approaches to teaching and learning.

#### **Programme and Course Advice**

#### **Goals of the Course**

The major themes of the course: development, learning and teaching, are organised around two core questions: *How do we grow?* and, *How do we learn?* The first core question anchors the first five weeks of the course, focusing on key theories and concepts related to four types of human development: brain, language, cognitive, and social. The second core question anchors the last four weeks of the course and covers key theories and concepts related to human learning: behaviourist, cognitive, humanist, and Māori perspectives. By the end of the course, students will have an introductory understanding of developmental, psychological and learning theories; factors that impact on learning and teaching; and, the teacher's role in creating effective learning environments.

#### **Learning Outcomes**

By the end of this course it is expected that the student will be able to:

1. Demonstrate an understanding of developmental, psychological and learning theory.
2. Explain factors that impact on learning and development.
3. Describe the teacher's role in creating effective learning environments.

#### **Learning and Teaching**

There are 36 teaching hours for this course, comprising of two hours of lecture and two hours of tutorial weekly.
