



## WEN Mentoring Programme Information sheet

The University of Auckland's Women in Engineering Network has partnered with Aurecon to deliver a mentoring programme to support the growth of women in the engineering workforce.

The programme operates in two tiers; Part 2 students are mentored by a Part 3 or Part 4 student in their specialisation, and Part 3 and Part 4 mentors are in turn mentored in a small group by an Aurecon staff mentor.

The programme aims to prepare female students for success in the workforce, establish networks between female students and industry professionals, and strengthen networks between female students.

There are numerous benefits associated with participation in the programme including development of coaching and mentoring skills, enhancement of professional networks and receiving formal mentoring.

The programme requires commitment to each of the following elements (refer below) which must be clearly understood and agreed during the application process. The duration of the programme is eight months. Mentor and mentees agree to actively participate in the programme for the full duration of their engagement.
