Dr Alex Gunn – University of Otago

Alex Gunn currently chairs the editorial board of *New Zealand Journal of Education Studies* (NZARE) and contributes to the editorial boards of *Assessment Matters* (NZCER) and *Assessment, Testing and Applied Measurement* (Education Frontiers). Previously she was also a member of the board for the *Australasian Journal of Early Childhood* (2006-2016). Her journal work has involved establishing and refreshing journal aims and scope, developing and setting journal policy, and the usual reviewing of articles and mentoring of new and emerging authors.

Professor Janine Hayward – University of Otago

Janine is on the editorial board for *Political Science* and has been an Associate Editor for the Royal Society's journal of social sciences, *Kōtuitui*.

Professor Etienne Nel – University of Otago

Etienne Nel is Managing Editor of the *New Zealand Geographer* and Commissioning Editor for Australasia of *Local Economy* and the *Journal of Geography in Higher Education*. He is a member of the editorial boards of three other journals and a book series editor for Springer publications.
