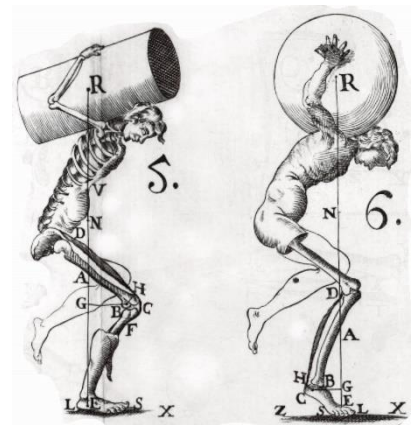


Motivating Pre-Medical Physics: by Using Physics

Like a sugar-coated pill, medically-themed physics leaves many with a bitter aftertaste. Behind the superficial 'relevance', it's still the same useless content; pre-medical students are too canny to fall for it. Genuine subject relevance can come from only one place: the subject itself. Is it possible for pre-meds to find physics inherently relevant? Is it possible for them to enjoy something so apparently inapplicable? This talk recalls one way that worked elsewhere, and that leads us to question what 'relevance' really means.
