**The Rise of Healthcare Hackathons as a Model for

Healthcare Hackathons (HCHs) are being increasingly used to generate innovation in healthcare delivery using technology and data, and as a model for cross-disciplinary education opportunities.

Mataroria will present the findings of his Master of Public Health practicum at Harvard University. His practicum encompassed an immersive field experience of a HCH in Khon Kaen, Thailand, and research to understand the educational benefits of HCHs, and their impact on healthcare delivery and outcomes.

Speaking up can be described as explicitly communicating observations, concerns, or explicitly challenging another's decision or action, which provides an opportunity to intervene before patient harm occurs or to mitigate actual harm.

We aim to explore the psychosocial factors influencing speaking up, and develop a reliable and valid measurement tool to measure the speaking-up climate.
