The Theory of Relativity in Selection into Medicine and Health Professions Programmes

Selection processes for medical and health profession programmes must result in cohorts of students with the appropriate attributes for the full range of careers in a health system. More diverse cohorts are more likely to achieve this, yet there are claims that increasing diversity may compromise excellence. Selection debate often focuses on individual tools, including their psychometric properties and predictive validity. The talk will discuss recent development in research into this topic in Australasia.
