Flipped classroom in undergraduate nursing education: Pedagogical designs and effectiveness

Youhasan is a doctoral candidate at the Centre for Medical and Health Sciences Education. His PhD focuses on implementing a flipped classroom pedagogy in the context of undergraduate nursing education.

He is a health professional educationist from Sri Lanka. As part of his doctoral study, Yuga conducted a systematic literature review and focus group interviews. This session will summarise some of the evidence from the systematic review regarding the pedagogical designs and effectiveness of the flipped classroom in the undergraduate nursing education.



Demystifying psychological connectedness to nature: A typology and its relation to pro-environmental tendencies

The psychology literature contains numerous concepts that describe and measure perceived connectedness to nature. Ties reviewed this literature, organising its key themes into a typology that generated novel predictions about how connectedness to nature relates to pro-environmental tendencies. Now working at the Centre for Medical and Health Sciences Education, he will explore how his PhD research, inspired by wanting to understand “deeper” pro-environmental tendencies, may inform ways to reinforce “deeper” prosocial tendencies in healthcare contexts.
