Programmatic Assessment: Fad or Foundation



In this presentation, Professor Jolly will describe the basis of programmatic assessment and identify solutions to conduct programmatic assessment efficiently. For example, having an exam management system that is connected to all assessment events to illustrate completion and quality of these assessments in a digestible form. Library bibliometrics would be another example of an efficient system.

Professor Brian Jolly is a Professor of Medical Education in the Joint Medical Program of the Universities of New Castle and New England. He was previously Professor of Medical Education and Director, Centre for Medical and Health Sciences Education at Monash University. Brian has interests in the development of clinical education generally and in the use of simulation for learning and assessment. A graduate in Psychology, Brian began working in medical education in 1972, initially as a producer of medical educational media. In 1989 he obtained a UK Enterprise in Higher Education grant for staff development and student-centred education - at that time the largest ever grant awarded for medical education.

Brian was a Deputy Editor of Medical Education over a 20 year period and has over 140 peer-reviewed publications, edited four books, and contributed chapters to many more. In 2008 he co-hosted the Ottawa International Conference on Medical Education in Melbourne.

After this talk Brian will retire from his post, and become a part time consultant for the Ardnell Group, an education consultancy that operates in Australia and New Zealand. He will otherwise be watching cricket (if available) and fishing.
