Use this login to use the wiki—post questions and participate in the wiki discussion.



#### Week 3: March 21-25

- Go to your POST-SEMINAR SCHOOL WORKSHOP on the CHALLENGE QUESTIONS .
- Work together with your group to develop answers to the challenge questions and place these on the wiki.
- Keep a watch on the wiki to see how the science and science education team respond to your answers. If they challenge you with a suggestion—follow through.
