For those of you still able to participate in the seminar, it's on this Thursday 16 September, and the topic is Rethinking Polynesian Origins: Human Settlement of the Pacific. It features the work of Allan Wilson Centre researcher Professor Lisa Matisoo-Smith, whom some of you may have seen in public lectures here in Auckland. This seminar will look at Lisa's work and how the story of human settlement of the Pacific has changed as a result of advances in biotechnological techniques. It will also look at examples of founder effects in the evolution of modern Polynesians.
