We strongly recommend that this process is carried out in study groups or class groups to ensure that students are working collaboratively.

Providing opportunities to use thinking skills and apply concept knowledge to new contexts.

A number of examiners reports in the past have noted that students entering the Biology Scholarship examination often struggle with questions where they are required to apply understanding of core concepts from the curriculum to new contexts. The seminar series challenge questions are designed to offer students the opportunity to apply their understanding and thinking to new contexts, and to have opportunities to interpret information presented in questions.

The LENScience team and the scientists involved in these seminars look forward to reading the student responses to the seminar challenge questions and assisting teachers to support students in the lead up to the end of year examinations. Also—don't forget to encourage your students to respond to the challenges from seminar 5. Many of you had exams that clashed with [Seminar 5](#), so the pages are still open and we look forward to your responses to the challenge questions.
