






hPOD Update: February 2016

Urgently Needed: Randomisations!

It is always hard at the beginning of the year to get things moving again and we know you are doing your best to discuss the study with families, and to recruit those interested. Thank you!

As you may have guessed, we are currently behind our recruitment targets. However with your help, we are confident that we will recover from our slow start to the year and power ahead with maximum recruitment (and randomisation) at each site. The addition of 'just' two or three more randomisations, at each site, will make a real difference to our total numbers and give us a solid foundation to build from in 2016.

We know that it takes time, patience, and often a lot of oneself to recruit interested families to a study, and we also know how disappointing it can be when we stumble at the 'randomisation hurdle'. If there is anything the hPOD Study Team can do to help encourage your wider-Team to learn more about the study and/or to help us get over this hurdle, please let us know. We offer group presentations/education sessions via videoconference or teleconference, and can also pop down to see you.

hPOD 2 year Follow-Up Study

The hPOD team has followed up 116 children at the end of February including several sets of twins which requires a whole team approach! Nearly all our Developmental Assessors have completed their training and can work independently now and there will be up to ten children per week eligible for follow-up in the coming months. Some feedback from two Mothers of two year old participants to follow-up this week ...
